

Title: File-sharing and viruses On-line Gaming Subject: Computing		Year: 3 Duration: 1 week
Teaching Ideas	Programs	National Curriculum Objectives
<p>Pupils should build on their knowledge in Year 2 of the dangers of email attachments and what to do if they are unsure of an email attachment they receive. They could watch and discuss 'Lady Jane Grey – Beware What You Download'.</p> <p>Pupils should learn about illegal downloading and discuss the possible consequences of this. Pupils could watch Faux Paw's Dangerous Downloads (discussing illegal downloading of music and the consequences). They could also visit the Kidsmart website – 'File Sharing' and create their own webpage with their own list of do's and don'ts for children.</p> <p>Discuss what online gaming is. Do any pupils use on-line gaming at home? (e.g. Xbox 360) Who do they play with? Do they have any rules at home? Pupils could watch 'Faux Paw Goes to the Games' and discuss the advantages and disadvantages.</p> <p>Pupils could create a set of 'dos' and 'don'ts' for online gaming and present these (e.g. through webpage creation, video tips, presentation).
