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NATIONAL CURRICULUM

History

Pupils will learn about changes within living memory through exploring how their own childhood compare to the childhood of their grandparents/ great grandparents (toys, entertainment, daily life, transport).

Historical Knowledge

- Know the differences between now and when grandparents were little (similarities/differences) including knowing that people older than me, were born before me, people that are younger than me, were born after me and times were slightly different when my parents / carers were little
- Know a timeline showing key family events
- Know what life was like when parents/carers were little
- Know that transport has changed over the last century
- Know that clothes have changed over the last century
- Know that toys have changed over the last century
- Know how technology has changed over the last century



Chronological Understanding

- Understand common words and phrases relating to the passing of time.
- Sequence people, events or objects taught so far.

Historical Enquiry

- Ask simple questions about a significant event/person in history.
- Use a given source (e.g. diary entry, artefacts) to find facts about the past.
