







































West Meadows Primary School Advice for Year 1 Parents

It can be tricky to know how to help your child's progress in reading at home. The below serves as a useful guide as to the kinds of questions and discussions you may have with your children.

Vocabulary What the words in a text mean.

Can you find a word that means...?

Why do you think they used the word...?

Can you find a word that means...?

What other word could they have used instead of...?

Predict

What we think will happen next.

Where do you think...will go next?
What do you think they will say/do next?
How do you think this book will end? Why?
What might they say about that?

Infer

Using 'clues' to understand the text

What do you think...means? Why?

Why do you think...?

How do you think...?

When do you think?

How has the writer made us think that?

Explain

Saying what we think and why.

Do you agree with...?

Did do the right thing?

Why did disagree with...?

What would you have done?

Retrieve

Recalling key events from the text.

Who is/are the main characters?

When/where is the story set?

Tell me three facts you have learned from the book.

Which is your favourite part?

Sequence

Ordering the events in a text.

What happened after...?

What happens at the beginning?

How did the story end?

Can you tell me what happened in the story in less than 20 words?
