





I can describe the dynamics and pitch in a piece of music.


Dynamics: From Loud

Pitch: From High

I can compare the dynamics of one piece/note to another.

I can compare the pitch of one piece/note to another.

I can reflect on a piece of music and say how it makes me feel.



I can explain why a piece of music makes me feel a certain way.

A fast piece of music makes you feel rushed or busy. Instruments may include a piano or drums.

A slow piece of music makes you feel relaxed or calm. Instruments may include a harp or a flute.



mood	a feeling, such as happy or sad
pitch	how high or low the notes are
pulse	is a steady beat like a ticking clock or your heartbeat
rhythm	the pattern of long and short sounds as you move through the song
tempo	the speed (fast, slow)

What should I know by the end?

Music makes us feel different emotions.

Dynamics is the volume of a piece/ note.

The pitch is how high or low notes are.

I know that different instruments create different sounds and are played in different ways.
