

Key beliefs



Buddhism is a religion which began over 2500 years ago. Buddha's real name is Siddhartha Gautama. He only became known as the Buddha after he had found enlightenment. Enlightenment means he found the truth about life.

Special Places

The Buddhist place of worship is a temple or Vihara. Every temple has at least one statue or image of Buddha. Buddhists go to the temple to:

- worship the image of Buddha
- to meditate
- give offerings to Buddha

Siddhartha Gautama (Buddha) became enlightenment in Lumbini, which was then in India and is now in Nepal. He meditated under a Bondi tree

	<p><i>Special festivals:</i></p> <p><i>Wesak is the Buddha's birthday. It is celebrated on the full moon in May and is the most important Buddhist festival.
