


NATIONAL CURRICULUM

What should I already know?

- Understand that some books are special and further explore the Guru Granth Sahib. Understand what it is, where it is kept, who reads it and why it is important.
- Explore the Gurdwara being a special place where Sikhs go to worship. Discuss that it is the home of the Guru Granth Sahib. Be able to talk about how you should behave in a special place. Understand that there are a set of rules for visiting a Gurdwara. That the Gurdwara is a place where the Sikh community prepare food - Langar, a place to share a meal with your extended family and friends.
- Describe how Sikhs celebrate special times such as Diwali.
- Understand that some stories are special to Sikhs. Listen to a story of one of the 10 Gurus e.g. Guru Har Gobind: the story of Diwali, the Guru and his cloak. Be able to reflect upon these stories and state why they are important to Sikhs.



What will I know by the end of this unit?

- Be aware of how Sikhs treat the Guru Granth Sahib.
- Understand the rules of behaviour in a special place.
- Identify some Sikh values.
- Understand why Guru Nanak's birthday is special to Sikhs.
- Recognise the effect the ten Gurus had on the way that Sikhs live their lives.
