What should I already know?

Geographical Skills and Fieldwork

- Use maps to locate Hoyland and Filey.

- Visit a coastal area (Filey) and make observations.
- Identify human and physical features of Filey and compare these to Hoyland. Explain why some of these features can only be found by the coast (cliff, beach, harbour, port).

Lifeboat Centre

- Understand the lifeboat centre is run by volunteers.
- They go out to sea to save people whose boat has broken down or are in danger.
- They offer advice on how to stay safe in the water.
- There are over 400 boats in the fleet.
- There are two types of boats:
 - All-weather lifeboats and inshore lifeboats.
- All-weather lifeboats (ALBs) are capable of high speed and can be operated safely in all weather conditions.
- Inshore lifeboats (ILBs) usually operate closer to shore, in shallower water, near cliffs, rocks and even caves.

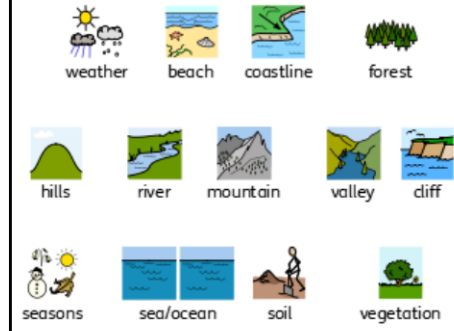
