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<p>What should I know by the end?</p> <p>Using articles with sports</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> We are used to seeing the articles 'le' and 'la' before nouns. 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<p>Conjugating verbs</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In French, the spelling of a word changes depending on who is doing the verb. Lots of root verbs in French end in 'er', and all 'er' verbs follow the same rules when changing the spellings. In this topic we will use the verb 'jouer' – to play. When we are using 'jouer' with a pronoun, we take off the 'er' and put the correct ending on.
