<b>Week:</b>	<b>Lesson Object:</b>	<b>Lesson Content:</b>	<b>Assessment:</b>
Week 1 <b>Q1 Why are these words special?</b>	LO: Recognise that some books are special.	Identify which books are special to them and why - Recognise that special books are often handled and looked after in a special way. Bring in their special books (teacher's too) and display them.	I can describe my special book and say why it is special to me.
Week 2 <b>Q2 Why are some places special?</b>	LO: Recognise that the Gurdwara is a special place for Sikhs.	Learn that the Gurdwara is a special place where Sikhs go to worship. It is the home of the special book Guru Granth Sahib. Look at a wide variety of pictorial representations of Gurdwaras eg - Virtual tour - Video - Photographs – Posters I can describe my special place and why it is so special.	I know that the Gurdwara is a special building for Sikhs.
Week 3 <b>Q3 How can faith contribute to community cohesion?</b>	LO: Identify some outward signs of belonging from their own lives.	Think about some 'outward signs' that they 'belong' eg a school uniform, badges of clubs, football strips.	I can list the places I 'belong' to and talk about ways in which this is shown. I can talk about other special outward signs eg football teams.
Week 4 <b>Q4 Why are sometimes special?</b>	LO: Recognise that all religions celebrate special days.	Discuss what celebration means and: – What we celebrate? – Why we celebrate? – How we celebrate?	I can describe my own experience of celebrations: - Clothes - Food – Preparations.
Week 5 <b>Q5 What can be learned from the lives of faith leaders?</b>	LO: describe who is important to me.	Identify people who are special in the: - Family - Community – School.	I can respond through talk, pictures, role-play my understanding of 'special people'.

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<p>Week 6 <b>Q6 How do I and others feel about the universe around us?</b></p>	<p>LO: show an awareness of some Sikh values.</p>	<p>Learn about the role of the Khalsa to protect. Hear stories about the founding of the Khalsa to defend the faith and to stand up for those who could not defend themselves. Look at the Panj Kakke (5k's) and at how they remind Sikhs of these ideas today eg the dagger reminds them not to let injustices happen, and the shorts remind them of the importance of freedom and of protecting the vulnerable.</p>	<p>I can describe some Sikh values.</p>
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
