| | Key Objectives In EYFS Expressive Arts and Design children will: |

| 3 to 4 years | Use large-muscle movements to wave flags and streamers, paint and make marks. Choose the right resources to carry out their own plan Use one-handed tools and equipment, for example, making snips in paper with scissors. Use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils. |
| Reception / F2 | Develop their small motor skills so that they can use a range of tools competently, safely and confidently. Use their core muscle strength to achieve a good posture when sitting at a table or sitting on the floor. Develop overall body-strength, balance, coordination and agility. |
| Early Learning Goal | PD: Fine Motor Skills: - Hold a pencil effectively in preparation for fluent writing - using the tripod grip in almost all cases. |

| 3 to 4 years | Make imaginative and complex 'small worlds' with blocks and construction kits, such as a city with different buildings and a park. Explore different materials freely, to develop their ideas about how to use them and what to make. Develop their own ideas and then decide which materials to use to express them. Join different materials and explore different textures. |
| Reception / F2 | Explore, use and refine a variety of artistic effects to express their ideas and feelings. Return to and build on their previous learning, refining ideas and developing their ability to represent them. |
